Position Information

Positions currently exist in statewide for the Senior Radiologic Technologist, Correctional Facility (Specialist) and (Supervisor), with the California Correctional Health Care Services.

A Senior Radiologic Technologist, Correctional Facility (Specialist) performs the full range of duties as the sole Radiologic Technologist, Correctional Facility (CF), in a State correctional facility or personally performs the most difficult technical work; instructs or leads other Radiologic Technologists, CF, as well as clerical staff or inmates; maintains inventory, orders required supplies, and has responsibility for storage and dispensing of supplies; maintains and updates procedures manuals; coordinates maintenance services on machinery; assists in the preparation of the radiologic department’s annual budget; maintains order and supervises the conduct of inmates and maintains the safety of persons and property; and does other related work.

A Senior Radiologic Technologist, CF (Supervisor) supervises at least three civil service Radiologic Technologists, CF, who provide the full range of radiographic services to State correctional facilities, as well as clerical staff and inmates; does not directly supervise Senior Radiologic Technologists, CF (Specialist); performs under the direction of the chief of the medical facility; directs, assigns, and checks the work performed in the radiologic facility; coordinates the radiologic function in conjunction with staff requirements; keeps abreast of current developments in the field of radiologic technology; reviews, revises, and develops procedures as necessary, ensuring compliance with State laws and departmental policies and procedures; instructs and evaluates lower level radiologic personnel and takes appropriate action with respect to their work performance where necessary; prepares the radiologic department’s annual budget; maintains order and supervises the conduct of inmates and maintains the safety of persons and property; and does other related work.

Who Can Apply

All applicants who meet the education and/or experience requirements as stated below may apply.

Minimum Qualifications

Qualifying experience may be combined on a proportionate basis if the requirements stated below include more than one pattern and are distinguished as either "I," or "II," or "III," etc. For example, candidates who possess qualifying experience amounting to 50% of the required time of Pattern I and additional experience amounting to 50% of the required time of Pattern II may be admitted to an examination as meeting 100% of the overall experience requirement.

Possession of a current valid certificate as a certified Radiologic Technologist in diagnostic radiologic technology issued by the California State Department of Health Services. (Applicants who are in the process of securing such certification will be admitted to the examination but must possess such certificate before they will be considered eligible for appointment.) **And**

Either I

One year of experience performing the duties of a Radiologic Technologist, Correctional Facility in the California state service.

Or II

Three years of experience, including training in radiologic techniques and methods, under an accredited medical radiologist. (Successful completion of the work required for a graduate nurse may be substituted for one year of this required experience and training.)

Or III

Experience: One year of experience as a radiologic technologist. **And**

Education: Successful completion of a two-year training program in radiologic technology approved by the Council on Medical Education and Hospitals of the American Medical Association, in collaboration with the American College of Radiology.

Special Personal Characteristics: Tact, alertness, vision sufficient to perform the essential functions of the job; empathetic understanding of patients of a State correctional facility; willingness to work in a State correctional facility; emotional stability; patience; and keenness of observation.

Special Physical Characteristics: Persons appointed to this position must be reasonably expected to have and maintain sufficient strength, agility and endurance to perform during stressful (physical, mental and emotional) situations encountered on the job without compromising their health and well-being or that of their fellow employees or that of inmates.

Minimum Qualifications (Continued)

Assignments may include sole responsibility for the supervision of inmates and/or the protection of personal and real property.

Additional Desirable Qualifications: Education equivalent to graduation from high school and a Therapeutic Radiologic Technologist certificate.

Applicants possessing the required license/certificate at the time of application must show the number, title, and expiration date on their Examination Application (Std. Form 678).

Examination Information

These examinations consist solely of an evaluation of each candidate's experience and/or education related to the duties of the positions. For this reason, it is especially important that candidates accurately complete their applications. You are encouraged to list all experience(s) relevant to the "Position Information" and "Minimum Qualifications" shown on this bulletin. In order to obtain a position on the eligible lists, a minimum rating of 70.00% must be attained.

How to Apply and Test (Continued)

The testing period for these examinations is six (6) months. Once you have taken the examination, you may not retest for six (6) months.

Eligible List Information

The resulting eligible lists will be established to fill vacancies within the California Correctional Health Care Services. Names of successful candidates are merged onto the lists in order of final scores, regardless of date. Eligibility expires 12 months after it is established, unless the needs of the service and conditions of the lists warrant a change in this period.

Veteran's Preference and Career Credits

Veteran's Preference will be awarded in this examination. All persons who successfully pass this examination, who qualify for, and have requested Veteran's Preference will be placed in Rank 1 of the respective eligibility list, regardless of score. Career credits will not be granted in this examination.

General Information

Applications are available at the State's career website at jobs.ca.gov, local offices of the Employment Development Department, the California Correctional Health Care Services, and at the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation.

If you meet the requirements stated in this bulletin, you may take this examination, which is competitive. Possession of the entrance requirement(s) does not assure a place on the eligible list. All candidates who pass the examination described in this bulletin will be ranked according to their scores.

Eligible Lists: Eligible lists established by a competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) sub-divisional promotional; 2) departmental promotional; 3) multi-departmental promotional; 4) service wide promotional; 5) departmental open; 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first.

The California Correctional Health Care Services reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revisions will be in accordance with civil service laws and rules and all competitors will be notified.

General Qualifications: Competitors must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, ability to work cooperatively with others, and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required. In open examinations, an investigation may be made of employment records and personal history, and fingerprinting may be required.

High School Equivalence: Equivalence to completion of the 12th grade may be demonstrated in any one of the following ways: 1) passing the General Educational Development (GED) test; 2) completion of 12 semester units of college-level work; 3) certification from the State Department of Education, a local school board, or high school authorities that the candidate is considered to have education equivalent to graduation from high school; or 4) for clerical and accounting classes, substitution of business college work in place of high school on a year-for-year basis (high school is four years).

Veteran's Preference: California law allows the granting of Veteran's Preference to any veteran, widow, or widower of a veteran, or spouse of a 100% disabled veteran who achieves a passing score in any Open examination to be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligibility list. Directions to apply for Veteran's Preference are on the Veteran's Preference Application (CalHR 1093) which is available from Department of Human Resources at <http://jobs.ca.gov/Job/VeteransInformation> and the Department of Veterans Affairs at <http://www.calvet.ca.gov/> Veteran's Preference is not granted once a person achieves permanent civil service status.

It is an objective of the State of California to achieve a drug-free work place.
